**From the Rector – The Rev. Sarah Nelson
October 6, 2023**



There is no “I” in team. “Of course not,” we say. “I know that.”
It takes a village to raise a child. “Of course,” we say.
Liturgy means the work of the people. “Of course,” we say.

Our new vestry has assumed its roles. Somehow we divide the ministry of the parish into a variety of categories, all the while knowing that the work of the church defies any such division. Like those old-fashioned Venn diagrams, there is much overlap between our attempts to categorize. Christian Education shares much with worship. Worship shares much with pastoral care. Pastoral care and outreach ministry are closely tied. Like a fine oiled machine, each area of ministry must work in sync with each other’s areas.

Like those rides at a fair where the whole circle spins while individual cars within that sphere also spin and turn on their own, each area of ministry must work in tandem with the others. Those ministries are the work of individuals with their own gifts and talents as well as their own hurts and history. There is no “I” in team and the work of the parish is the work of a team, a team of which we are all a part. It takes a village – yes, each of us are called to care for, to support, and, at times, to put our own desires behind in order to support the community, the church. These are all things that each of us know. These are things that are good to periodically remind ourselves.

Liturgy is the work of the people. In other words, it takes all of us working in tandem to do our part in the work of our prayer, “thy kingdom come, thy will be done.”

The ministry of Saint James is a ministry that I am honored to share with each of you. It is a ministry that we share together. It is a ministry not our own but the work of praising God and building the kingdom of God here among us.

The vestry will try things ... some will work amazingly well; some will not. Some things will live long in our memories; some we will hope to forget. This is our common life. Not yours and mine but **our** work. I often ask myself, “Who can I involve? How can I ask someone to join with me? What ideas does someone else offer that will make this better?”

I am excited about the possibilities that lie before us. I am honored to be on the team!

THE 4th SUNDAY IN THE SEASON OF CREATION THIS SUNDAY, OCTOBER 8, 2023 HUMANITY SUNDAY

T*his Sunday we will worship with all humanity, peoples of all ethnic origins. We celebrate the kinship between humanity and the rest of creation. We rejoice that humans who bear the image of God now understand that image in terms of their role as servants who follow Christ, the true image of God. We will hear Scriptures read from Genesis, Philippians, and Mark. In Mark’s Gospel, this text is often cited as a guide to the way we should live as disciples of Christ, serving others rather than dominating them. Jesus reminds us that among the Romans of his day, the aspiration of leaders was to dominate and control, to have power over others. Jesus declares that his way is just the opposite. His followers are to serve rather than rule. The text from Philippians 2 reinforces this truth. The prayers and hymns today will also be magnificently centered around humanity. The Parish Choir will sing “The Gift of Love,” an American Folk Tune arranged by Hal Hopson.*
