**From the Rector – The Rev. Sarah Nelson  
November 17, 2023**



Wow! Saint James is certainly busy this holiday season: Pluck Norm the Turkey; Circle of Blessings; Christmas Cookies; Margie’s Tree; Food Donations for local families. Of course, what you participate in is your choice, but we are certainly busy! It is good and feels good to care for one another and the community around us. It is part of our living out our faith in the world.

Once a week we gather for worship, where we can glorify and praise our God. We gather to hear the words of scripture, to confess the times where we have missed the goal, and we gather to pray and lift up the concerns of our lives. We are then fed and nourished to go into the world to live our faith. Our dismissal prayer is “Go into the world to love and serve the Lord.” In other words, our Sunday gathering feeds and nourishes us to live our faith.

While not my idea but still an intriguing possibility, how does our worship inform our Monday through Saturday life? The second part of that question is how might our community of faith acknowledge, support, and celebrate our day-to-day lives centered in our identity as God’s people? The vestry will help me to further develop this idea and as we ponder the possibilities, I have asked a few people to share a paragraph talking about their ministry as not only what we do at Saint James but how we are beacons of faith in the world.

One of the church Fathers, Ignatius, uses a daily review of life to help this process. This examination asks such questions as: Where did I encounter Christ today? Where was I the face of Christ for others today? Where was Christ at work today that I missed? This is but one place to begin. I have asked Lisa Bove to share her experience serving on a jury. [***See Lisa’s Reflection on page 2.***] How is our civic responsibility reflective of our faith? If you would like to share an experience or reflection, please, please let me know. I am hopeful that this will help us to get to know one another better as well as to celebrate our ministries.

We are called in baptism to work to bring about God’s kingdom here on earth. We are doing that daily. My hope is that we are empowered in worship to go into the world to love and serve our God. Let us join with one another to highlight our kingdom building!

So, much as we might not like Jury Duty, I feel it is not only our civic responsibility, but also an opportunity for community, support, and outreach. Living our faith outside the walls of the church.
